Thank you for your generosity in support of the Capital Campaign! We share our heartfelt gratitude for each and every gift. To date, we have received over \$316,000 in generous gifts!

Your financial contributions fuel our mission and ensure that Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer continues to be a vibrant, growing church. Work has begun on the roof and new shingles have been installed. There have been 35 sheets of OSB underlayment that have had to be replaced. Air conditioner units have been replaced and are ready to take on the summer weather. As we take care of our physical building, we ensure that future generations will continue to be sheltered as they gather to deepen their faith.

It's not too late to give to the Capital Campaign. In addition to taking care of our physical building, the Capital Campaign contributions will pay off debt owed from the original building. 


