Baking is a perfect way to keep the feeling of Christmas going! And baking a batch of cookies for the *Watertown Sandwich Ministry* makes a big difference. Betty Wolff's Sugar Cookies are a tried & true recipe.

#### Sugar Cookies

1 c. butter ½ tsp. salt

1 c. shortening 1 tsp. vanilla or almond flavoring

1 c. powdered sugar 4 c. flour

1 c. white sugar 1 tsp. cream of tartar

2 eggs 1 tsp. soda

Cream butter, shortening and sugars. Add eggs, flavoring and salt. Add cream of tartar and soda. Add flour last. Stir well until blended. Roll into small balls, then dip into sugar. Press down with glass or fork. Bake 8 minutes in 350 degree oven.
