Today, we light the second candle on the Advent wreath as we remember that in Old Testament times, salt was added to offerings—the salt of the covenant, a pleasing aroma ascending to God. Jesus, the Holy Child of Bethlehem, the Word made flesh, was born among us. Through Jesus, his Son, God fulfilled his covenant promise to send the Savior, who came to offer himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world.

Jesus, through your sacrifice, you have brought us forgiveness and peace.

Jesus has called us to be both light and salt in the world. Jesus said, "Have salt in yourselves." Salt preserves food and adds flavor. Through our words and actions, we bring the saving taste of Jesus' love and compassion to the world.

Dear Savior, help us to reflect your love to the people we meet each day.



CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- To repent means "to turn around." When is a time you were headed in the wrong direction and had to turn around?
- God does not come to us and leave us unchanged. How does God's love shown in Jesus change you?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Luke 1:67-79.

This is a New Testament psalm known as the song of Zechariah. It is a very important song that has been used in the Matins (morning prayer) service over the centuries in the church. Zechariah is prophesying, meaning he is giving us a Spirit-filled message for our lives today. Zechariah prepares us for the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation that is about to happen. The psalm is a beautiful testimony to "the tender mercy of our God" (v. 78) that will bring joy to the world. The promise of a messenger to prepare the way of the Lord (Malachi 3:1-4) is being fulfilled with the birth of Zechariah's and Elizabeth's son, John the Baptist. Reread Luke 1:67-79 and pause to feel the joy and gladness of Zechariah's song with the message that will "quide our feet into the way of peace" (v. 79b). Discuss: How does reading Zechariah's song bring you peace and joy?

Pray: Merciful God, you have prepared us for a joy we cannot fully imagine. Bless us now and always with the light of Christ to guide our feet into the way of peace. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how might you help someone experience the peace of God's presence?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



The second candle on the Advent Wreath symbolizes the theme of peace. Discuss or think about how preparing the way of the Lord can bring peace. Light the first candle of hope and the second candle of peace on the Advent Wreath.

Say: Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied: And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High, for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways.

(Luke 1: 67, 76)

Pray: Lord God, as we prepare for the coming of our Savior and Lord, guide our feet into the way of peace. Amen.
