# DISH TO PASS

Sometimes things just seem "too much" and "too complicated" – and we're tempted to just ignore them. For example, I've had a pile of boxes, filled with assorted papers (and other junk) sitting in my kitchen for the past two weeks. They're not really in the way, but they are certainly out of place.

I have a similar drawer in my office here at work – a "catch all" space containing all sorts of things that don't seem to fit in anywhere else. This drawer served me well last week when someone asked if we had a written history of the amazing stained glass windows here at LCOOR. (I knew exactly where it was!)

This made me recall another drawer I had claimed back when I worked at the YMCA. Because it was a shared workspace, there was only one drawer to call my own. I labeled it the "Drawer of Wonder." It puzzled my co-workers, but I was able to stash things there until I needed them.

If you wonder where I'm going with all this, it's pretty simple. We are all "drawers of wonder," filled with unique ways to offer encouragement when life gets "too complicated." Sometimes a kind word can make all the difference in their world.

#### BEV SPLINTER'S STRAWBERRY RHUBARB CREAM CHEESE BARS

FOR THE FILLINGS:
4 CUPS CHOPPED RHUBARB
1-3 OZ. PKG. STRAWBERRY JELLO
1 CUP SUGAR
2-8 OZ. BRICKS CREAM CHEESE (AT ROOM TEMPERATURE)
1 CUP SUGAR
2 EGGS
1 TSP. VANILLA

FOR THE CRUST/TOPPING: 2-1/2 CUPS ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR 1 CUP FIRMLY PACKED BROWN SUGAR 1 CUP BUTTER, CHILLED

Preheat the oven to 350-degrees (F). In a mixer bowl, combine flour, and brown sugar on low. Add cut butter and mix on low until mixture becomes coarse crumbs. Put 2/3 of the crust mixture into the bottom of a parchment-lined 9x13" pan. Press it down to create the crust. Bake in the oven for 10-15 minutes or until it just starts to be a tiny bit golden on the edges.

In a medium—sized bowl, coat the rhubarb with the jello and 1 cup of the sugar. Set aside. In the mixer bowl, combine room temperature cream cheese and sugar until light and fluffy. Add the eggs and vanilla. Mix at medium speed until well—blended.

Pour the cream cheese mixture over the partially—baked crust, and spread it evenly. Sprinkle the coated rhubarb/strawberry mixture over the cream cheese (be aware that the cream cheese mixture is soft, so you won't be able to do a lot of spreading without getting it all mixed up). Top with the remaining crust mixture.

Bake at 350-degrees (F) for 45-50 minutes until the edges are brown and bubbling, and the center is still kind of wobbly when you shake it, but not too wobbly. Cool on a cooling rack for about an hour, then refrigerate for at least 3 hours.
