Welcome

Inspired by the abundant hospitality of Jesus Christ, Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer welcomes all of God's children into the life of the church as 'we make God known through words and deeds'.

Call to Worship (Based on the Noah story found in Genesis 6-9.)

God is troubled and saddened that the people of earth have turned away and forgotten how to live as God's people. Except for one person: Noah.

God promises the future of all humanity to Noah, and tells him to build a big boat to carry the start of a new creation. Noah does what God tells him to do.

At 600 years of age, Noah and his family, and two of every kind of living being, enter the ark.

It rains for 40 days and 40 nights, and Noah's family and every living thing spend 150 days together in the ark.

As the waters recede, the ark comes to rest on top of a high mountain, and Noah's family and every living creature again inhabit the earth.

And God paints a rainbow in the sky as a visible promise that there will never be another flood. We can trust this promise that comes from our God who is Three in One: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Confession and Forgiveness

In the name of the Father, and of the $\,\pm\,$ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

God of all mercy and consolation, come to the help of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that we may confess our sin, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the fullness of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.** *(Silence is kept for reflection)* Most merciful God,

we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen.

In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

First Reading

Genesis 9:8-17

⁸Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him, ⁹"As for me, I am establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you, ¹⁰and with every living creature that is with you, the birds, the domestic animals, and every animal of the earth with you, as many as came out of the ark. ¹¹I establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all flesh be cut off by the waters of a flood, and never again shall there be a flood to destroy the earth." ¹²God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: ¹³I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. ¹⁴When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, ¹⁵I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. ¹⁶When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth." ¹⁷God said to Noah, "This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth."

James 1:17-27

¹⁷Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. ¹⁸In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures. ¹⁹You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; ²⁰for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. ²¹Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls. ²²But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. ²³For if any are hearers of

the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; ²⁴for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. ²⁵But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing. ²⁶If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world. Gospel Reading

Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

¹Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around [Jesus], ²they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. ³(For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; ⁴and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) ⁵So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, "Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?" ⁶He said to them, "Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; ⁷in vain do they worship me, teaching human precepts as doctrines.' ⁸You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition." ¹⁴Then he called the crowd again and said to them, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: ¹⁵there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile. ²¹"For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, ²²adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly. ²³All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

WEEKLY MILESTONES

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- What guidelines do you follow to live a good and healthy life?
- How are God's commandments a gift to us?

DEVOTIONS

Read: Mark 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23.

In this reading, the Pharisees and scribes, who obey teachings of their ancestors, question the purity of the disciples. It is easy in our religious zeal to condemn certain conduct, like eating with unwashed hands, that misses the heart of the faith. This was true of Pharisees and scribes in the first century and followers of Jesus in the twenty-first century. What truly separates us from God's will is not our maintaining a superior cleanliness but not harming others with our conduct. The intent of God's commandments seeks to promote and protect life for individuals and for entire communities. Jesus mentions a number of sins, actions that destroy human relationships, like theft, murder, pride, deceit, and more, the kinds of actions condemned by the commandments of God. Jesus says, *"it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come"* (v. 21). It's the evil heart, destructive human intentions, that are so harmful to us and those around us. Following Jesus is about being freed from our own sins to care for others as God wills us to do.

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Discuss: How do God's commandments protect you and others?

Pray: Righteous God, thank you for leading us to acts of love and mercy through Jesus, the one who came that we may be freed from all that separates us from you. Amen.

SERVICE 💋

Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, how can you show kindness and mercy to others this week?

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

In James 1:17-27, we are told to *"be doers of the word"* (v. 22). Christian spirituality involves a life of action, a life of service. Take a moment to think or talk about what this means to you. Open your Bible to this reading. Highlight or underline words that describe ways to be a doer of God's word.

Pray: Lord God, help me to be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger, and a doer, not merely a hearer of your word. In Jesus' name, amen.
