"We can't expect people to show up at our door. We have to go out and meet people where they are. This is the early Christian church model of taking the gospel out." This statement was made by a pastor during the 2024 SD Synod Assembly.

## Dish to Pass by Twila Schmitt

"For all the Saints, who from their labors rest..."

This hymn has been playing in my subconscious over the past couple weeks...and it connects me to my Grandma Cece who died on Sept. 29, 2012. She reached the beautiful age of 98 – and incidentally was born on All Saints' Day.

"Who Thee by faith before the world confessed; Thy name, O Jesus, be forever blest. Alleluia, Alleluia!"

While I was growing up, Grandma lived nearby – and she would always light up whenever one of her grandchildren stopped by to visit. We always felt that we were the very best thing to happen to her when we were in her presence. This ability to make us feel special continued throughout her life. (I've since learned that this wasn't limited to her grandchildren!)

As All Saints' Day approaches, we at Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer are preparing to recognize and remember those saints in our church family who have gone on before us. For those who have lost someone recently, this can be an especially emotional time. While our worship services mention those who have died since last All Saints' Day, we also encourage you to remember all who have made a lasting impact in your life.

"But then there breaks a still more glorious day: the saints triumphant rise in bright array; the King of glory passes on His way. Alleluia, Alleluia!"

While re-reading my Grandma Cece's obituary this week, I realized that it began with this verse: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. – Philippians 1:21" And later it stated, "If you knew her, she has probably prayed for you!" Both are remarkable words to include – and so true!

"From earth's wide bounds, from ocean's farthest coast, through gates of pearl streams in the countless host, in praise of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Alleluia, Alleluia!"

Amazing to think that this hymn, written by William W. How in 1864, can still ring true today. But I'm so thankful that it does! Alleluia!

# "Angel Crisps"

½ c. brown sugar
½ c. white sugar
½ c. butter
1 tsp. vanilla
2 c. flour
1 tsp. soda

½ c. Crisco 1 tsp. cream of tartar

1 egg 1/2 tsp. salt


Cream sugars, egg, butter, Crisco and vanilla. Sift flour, soda, salt and cream of tartar. Add dry ingredients to creamed mixture. Roll in balls, dip top half into water and then sugar. Bake at 350 for 8-10 minutes.


