1. What are some reasons that we pray?

2. What are some ways that we can pray?

Dig Deeper

1. For the next few months we are going to be learning about the Lord’s Prayer. Why do you think it is called “The Lord’s Prayer?”

2. When Jesus prays “Our Father,” he uses the Aramaic word “Abba.” What does Abba mean?

3. If Jesus teaches us to pray addressing God as “Daddy,” what kind of relationship do you think that God wants to have with us?

4. The Small Catechism is a book written by Martin Luther that we will be using throughout confirmation. Open yours to page 19 or open your Small Catechism app and go to “The Lord’s Prayer” and read together the Introduction to the Lord’s Prayer and “What Does this Mean?”
5. Luther says that these words help us to think of God as our Father so that we might ask God boldly and with confidence just as children ask their father. Are you more bold in your asking with a parent or trusted adult than you are someone else? Why? Does thinking about God in that way change the way you might pray?

Bible Story OF THE WEEK The Prayer that Jesus Taught Us

1. Read **Matthew 6:9-14** and **Luke 11:1-4**. These are the two places you can find the Lord’s prayer. Notice that they are a bit different. How are they different, and how are they the same?
2. Why do you think that they are different?
3. In the Luke version Jesus is alone praying, then the disciples come and ask him to teach them to pray. Read Matthew 6:5-8. What is happening in Matthew when Jesus teaches the Lord’s prayer?

TAKING IT HOME/TAKING IT TO GOD

1. Talk about ways you might be able to pray for one another this week and then use those requests in a closing prayer

BACK TO THE FRONT: SENDING OUT

With your group, go to the Baptismal Font in the Sanctuary. Gather around the font and make a sign of the cross on your own forehead saying, *“I belong to Christ. We belong to each other.”*
