SCRATCH THE SURFACE

1. What does “hallowed” mean?
2. The video that we watched used the sun as a metaphor for God’s holiness. How so?
3. According to the video, God’s holiness is seen in purity laws. How did God in Jesus reimagine ritual purity?
4. When we pray “Hallowed be your name” what are we praying?

Dig Deeper

1. We are learning about the first petition of the Lord’s Prayer tonight. Read together page 20 of your Small Catechism or open your Small Catechism app and go to “The Lord’s Prayer” and scroll down to “The First Petition”. What does it mean when we ask that God’s name be Hallowed?
2. What commandment does this petition of the Lord’s Prayer connect?

3. What are some ways that Lord's name might be used in vain in prayer?
4. Does this mean that we can't pray prayers of doubt or fear or prayers questioning God?
5. How do you hallow God when you pray?

Bible Story OF THE WEEK Mark 14:32-42 Jesus Prays in Gethsemane

1. Jesus has told the disciples that he will be betrayed, killed, and rise again. Now Jesus goes to pray. What does Jesus pray for?
2. How does Jesus end his prayer?
3. How might our listening in on this prayer of Jesus' help us think about how God's name is hallowed in prayer?

TAKING IT HOME/TAKING IT TO GOD

Talk about ways you might be able to pray for one another this week and then use those requests in a closing prayer

BACK TO THE FRONT: SENDING OUT

With your group, go to the Baptismal Font in the Sanctuary. Gather around the font and make a sign of the cross on your own forehead saying, "*I belong to Christ. We belong to each other.*"
