Bible Memory Verse: Romans 6:4

SCRATCH THE SURFACE

1. What is tonight’s memory verse?

2. What are the three benefits of Baptism?

DIG DEEPER

1. What good stuff do we receive by being baptized into Jesus’ death and resurrection?

2. How does baptism bring us forgiveness?

3. Discuss the video we saw, of the burned boy named Alfredo; what does this story/parable have to do with Baptism?

Who is an outsider at your school? When do you feel like an outsider?

4. Look up Romans 6:4. Why is the baptismal font at the entrance of the church?

5. Look up Acts 22:16. Why is water used in Baptism?

6. Look up John 4:13-15. Why is the baptismal water flowing like a fountain?

Bible Background: Paul and Silas were followers of Jesus and were in prison because the Roman government did not like Christians. If you have time, you may also want to read the verses leading up to this text, Acts 16:1-24.

1. What were Paul and Silas doing when the earthquake occurred?
2. What happened to the prison when the earthquake occurred?
3. When the jailer saw the prison doors opened, what was he going to do? Why?
4. When the jailer saw the prison doors miraculously opened and that the prisoners did not try to escape, what did he ask Paul and Silas?
5. The jailer recognized the power of Paul’s and Silas’ God. How did they answer the jailer’s “salvation” question?
6. How do you think the jailer’s life changed after he was baptized?

TAKING IT HOME

1. Review the Bible memory verse. Explain it in your own words.
2. Are there people in school who may feel like “outsiders” and need to be brought “inside” your circle of friends? Could you invite them to church?

TAKING IT TO GOD

Pray a prayer of thanks to God for washing your sins away and for making you His child. Pray for everyone who is on the “outside.”

BACK TO THE FONT : SENDING OUT

With your group, go to the baptismal font. Make the sign of the cross on your forehead, and say:
“I belong to Christ; we belong to each other.”
