REVIEW

1. What are the 2 Sacraments we practice?

DIG DEEPER

1. Holy Communion is a meal of remembrance of two events: Passover and Jesus’ death and resurrection.
 - a. Is Passover in the Old Testament or New Testament?

 - b. It happened approximately how many years before Jesus lived?

 - c. God’s people, the Jews, were in slavery to what country?

 - d. God raised up Moses to free his people by sending 10 plagues. Describe the 10th and final plague.

 - e. Describe how “Passover” became the name of the greatest Jewish holiday.

 - f. What does the Passover celebration mean to the Jews?

1. The second way Holy Communion is a meal of remembrance is of Jesus’ accomplishment on the cross.
 - a. What did Jesus accomplish through the cross?

 - b. What were Jesus’ final words on the cross? What did they mean?

 - c. What does the cross have to do with Holy Communion?

 - d. Is Jesus really present at Holy Communion?

1. What was the festival Jesus wanted to celebrate, and with whom?
2. In verse 21, what was Jesus referring to?
3. Do you think the disciples understood what Jesus said about the bread being his body and wine being his blood?
4. Why did Jesus die, and why did he give the bread and wine?

Taking It Home

1. Why would someone in crisis (sick or a death in the family) want to receive Holy Communion?
2. Ask your Parent Leader about a particular time when Holy Communion was important to them. Why?
