April 7, 2021**“Resurrection: The Most Important Matter for Christians!”**

Bible Memory Verse: The angel in the tomb said: “He is not here; he has been raised from the dead, just as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.” (Matthew 28:6)

SCRATCH THE SURFACE (10 MINUTES)

1. What items in the sanctuary remind you of the Easter message? Why?
2. How do you celebrate Easter and Resurrection in your home? How do they portray the Resurrection at Easter? What things do you do that are cheap gimmicks and not really Easter related?
3. How was tonight’s lesson different from last week’s subject?

DIG DEEPER (10 minutes)

1. Why is the Resurrection of Jesus so important for Christians?
2. Why is the Resurrection message so hard to comprehend?
3. Last week we talked about death and funerals. How does the resurrection of Jesus change such harsh and sad realities?
4. Describe the emptiness you saw in the video clip. What does it mean to be empty? How is the empty tomb different?

BIBLE STORY – 1 Corinthians 15:1-8 (10 minutes)

Note: These verses were written about 30 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus by a man named Paul, who was an early leader of the Christians. Paul is explaining how the resurrection of Jesus happened and what it means.

1. In verse 1, Paul calls the message of Jesus “GOOD NEWS.” Why is it good news?

2. Read verse 3. What does Paul call the resurrection of Jesus? Why?
3. To prove the reality of the resurrection, Paul lists for the Corinthian Christians all the different people the resurrected Jesus appeared to. Who were they? How many saw Jesus with nail holes in his hands and feet
